Summary:-

- Good progress has been made against objectives in 2018. The Northern Ireland Council has connected with the wider MS community through our programme of events and has ensured that the day to day experiences of people with MS is heard and understood.
- Northern Ireland has faced a number of challenges in 2018 from the introduction of PIP to the serious incident of the
 patient recall impacting on a high number of people with MS. Taking into account this all took place with the
 suspension of the Northern Ireland Assembly and Executive, NI Council played its role in stepping up to make sure the
 MS Society's voice was heard by all stakeholders. Major focus was placed on the Council's involvement in meeting
 regularly with the local Health Trusts and Permanent Secretary to voice our concerns and to have input into the way
 forward. Speaking with Capita regarding the issues our community was telling us about PIP reviews led to the
 organisation creating an 'MS Champion' role. Council members also met with Walter Rader, the independent PIP
 reviewer for NI.
- Work has started on pulling together a Big Lottery Fund bid to deliver emotional wellbeing services and council members have played a part in participating in coproduction meetings to gather evidence for the bid.
- 2019 objectives will focus on engaging with the Groups, supporting fundraising and raising awareness of our services and support available to people affected by MS.

Summary:-

- Good progress made against objectives in 2018. Cymru Council continue to engage with local groups across Wales through Chairing
 and attending Volunteer Forums and being actively engaged in their own local groups in a variety of roles. Cymru Council members
 however will engage more with groups out with of the Volunteer Forums in 2019.
- One member stepped down late in 2017 and two members of the Cymru Council resigned in Spring/ Summer 2018 due to work
 commitments and health issues, so we have had three vacancies for the latter part of the year. We originally had eight nominations for
 six vacancies for election to the Cymru Council for 2019, however for a variety of reasons including ill health and a changes in personal
 circumstances only 5 new members have been elected, Cymru Council are seeking to co-opt to the final vacancy.
- Cymru Council have been active in campaigning in 2018, particular in relation to Treat me Right, MS Enough and Cannabis, linking with their local members of the National Assembly for Wales and Government Ministers. They have been involved in fundraising initiatives and supporting others to fundraise and are inspired and excited to be involved in the launch of the Public Phase of the STOP MS Appeal in 2019.
- Council members support MSS Cymru staff in the development and implementation of restricted funded projects supporting people living with MS in Wales, particularly through the local and national steering groups for the My MS, My Rights, My Choices project and the coproduction group of the Active Together (Wales) project.

General Summary

- 1. Good progress made against objectives set for 2018. The Council has worked closely with the local groups to support them, and provide feedback throughout the Society
- 2. Our main focus will be to support our local groups to engage with the membership review. Whilst most volunteers are extremely supportive there are a number who still do not understand the reasoning behind the planned changes
- 3. Campaigning is still a strong part of the work we do, but Council does feel that we could be utilised more in areas of fundraising. This may come to fruition in 2019 with us supporting the STOPMS appeal.
- 4. Recruitment for new council members was better than 2017. This, we believe, was due to the increased Social Media presence. For 2019 we will have 12 council members and three vacancies. We have a 50/50 mix on Gender and 67% of members have MS. We have also seen an improvement on ethnicity applicants and continue to work on this.
